PASTOR JASON

Church Family -

One of the things that I like about baseball is the numbers associated with it. I am a bit of what some call a "stat geek." Growing up, I loved to collect baseball cards, and my brother and I would often lay on our bunks and quiz each other on what stats were on the back of guys' cards. (Both my brother and I now acknowledge that between this and memorizing the script to Top Gun, we could have used our talents for a greater good by memorizing Scripture!) The numbers on the back of a card indicated what kind of player he was. We were able to measure his value to the team based on his batting average, home runs, wins, or strikeouts. It gave us a metric to measure worth.

One of the things I do not like about church life is the numbers we associate with it. Too often, we get hung up by looking at numbers to measure their value and worth. The adage was that a church's success can be measured by "nickels and noses": how big is your budget, and how many people are sitting in your church? A letter like this was then meant to boast about such numbers so that we can all feel good about what we are accomplishing as a church. And for those who like to read about that, I can throw many numbers at you that will make you feel good about the status of your church. The new attendees and members we have seen. The exponential growth we have seen in our children and youth activities. I can remind you of the budget on which we took a step of faith and how God has demonstrated his faithfulness through your sacrificial giving. I can even share my favorite number of how many salvations and baptisms we witnessed this past year! However, like in baseball, numbers do not tell the whole story.

In 1 Chronicle 29:10-19, King David has led Israel to one of the most fruitful places in their history. Things are going well, the Temple is undergoing construction, and numbers are high! Yet, David's words to Israel are not about what they have done, accomplished, or how bright their future is. Instead, his words are focused on the power and glory of the one they call God - YHWH. David's greatest attribute as a leader was to acknowledge that the metric of their success was not based on things that were measurable but rather on the immeasurables associated with God: his power, his glory, his victory, his majesty, his kingdom, his church!

Family, the future of Faith Church is very bright. But it is not because of numbers or leaders. The brightness is supplied by the never-fading glorious light of the God whom we serve and worship! God has been so good to us. We celebrate the fruits of his blessing seen in some measurable ways and some in immeasurable ways.
